STAFF POLITICAL IMPARTALITY POLICY

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As a secondary school staff member in the UK, it is important to maintain political impartiality in order to create a safe and inclusive learning environment for all students. This policy outlines the expectations for political neutrality and the actions to be taken in case of any violations.
